

Spurgeon Kennedy is President-elect of the National Association of Pretrial Services Agencies and former Director of the Office of Strategic Development for the Pretrial Services Agency for the District of Columbia. In that position, Mr. Kennedy helped lead the Agency's strategic planning initiatives and efforts to implement evidence-based practices and innovations. Previously, Mr. Kennedy served as Programs Manager with the U.S. Department of Justice's National Institute of Justice, overseeing the Institute's pretrial portfolio and helping to create and implement field tests, demonstration programs, and other applied research. He also served as a Senior Associate with the Pretrial Services Resource Center, a national clearinghouse and technical assistance provider for justice practitioners on the topics of pretrial release and detention, case processing, and jail population management.

During his nearly 40-year career, Mr. Kennedy has provided technical assistance and support to local, state, and national organizations and justice systems. He also has served as a facilitator or training faculty member for agencies such as the National Association of Pretrial Services Agencies, the American Probation and Parole Association, the National Institute of Corrections, the National Institute of Justice, the Office on Violence against Women, and state and Federal court, pretrial, and corrections organizations nationwide.

In addition, Mr. Kennedy has authored or co-authored several criminal justice articles and publications, including the recently published *Framework for Pretrial Justice: Essential Elements of a Pretrial System and Agency*.
