10 **ORDER**

11 WHEREAS, on November 13, 2020, the latest public health order was issued
12 to combat the increased spread of COVID-19 infections during the ongoing public
13 health emergency through enhanced restrictions on in-person gatherings;

14 WHEREAS, due to the urgent need to minimize in-person gatherings and out-
15 of-state travel to address the surge of COVID-19 infections, this matter has come
16 before the Court upon recommendation to amend the New Mexico Judiciary’s
17 Emergency Court Protocols to temporarily suspend jury trials until January 1, 2021,
18 while continuing to hold other judicial proceedings within strict limitations on in-
19 person judicial proceedings required by existing Emergency Court Protocols, and to
20 clarify out-of-state travel restrictions for judicial officers and judicial employees;

22 WHEREAS, the Court having considered the recommendation and being
23 sufficiently advised, Chief Justice Michael E. Vigil, Justice Barbara J. Vigil, Justice
24 Judith K. Nakamura, Justice C. Shannon Bacon, and Justice David K. Thomson
25 concurring;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the recommendation to temporarily suspend jury trials is ADOPTED and the amendment of Emergency Court Protocols Nos. 1, 2, and 3 is APPROVED, effective immediately.


