1	What is New Mexico's budget	Our expected budget is approximately \$150K - \$300K. We are committed to providing a compelling user experience to the public interacting with the judicial system and are seeking expertise to help us achieve this goal. We recognize that the cost will vary based on the expertise of the chosen vendor and the final the scope of work.
2	Are you able to share a budget for this project?	
3	Can you disclose a budget range or budget cap for this project?	
4	We see similar RFPs with budgets ranging from \$100K to well into six figures. Where in that range are you expecting to fall?	
5	Please provide an anticipated budget range, or NTE value. The budget information gives vendors the opportunity to realistically right-size their solutions/approaches within the parameters of available resourcing. Since web projects can vary widely in budget, from \$5,000 all the way upwards of \$1 million. We just need a very rough, general ballpark sense (i.e., less than \$100K, or \$100K-\$300K, \$300K-\$500K, or greater than \$500K). Clearly, competitive pressures will assure that the State still receives the most aggressive bids possible.

We do not anticipate the need for any complex workflows, and are open to input from the successful bidder regarding standard, logical workflows.

Please describe other pertinent details about the hosting environment.	We are open to recommendations, and expect this to be a subject of discussion and collaboration during the project.
69	Are there any particular weaknesses or pain points caused by the current CMS?	Some elements like .gifs and video take too long to load, high-value pages need to be optimized, content managers probably need periodic refresher training and to learn about updates to WordPress, poor retention, limited knowledge of Google Analytics, and no SEO. Also, vendor response time isn't optimal.
70	Please provide a sense of any key interactions that the site will need to have with other infrastructure (e.g. SSO), especially if the interactions are anything more than mere linking. It would be helpful if this could be enumerated on a system-by-system basis.	Currently, we do not have SSO linked to our CMS. The only interaction our current CMS has with another system is with our document manager.
71	Will the system store any personally identifiable information? If so, will this data be stored locally or with another provider?	There is no PII stored as part of the website.
72	Will new content need to be written for the new site? If so, how much help are you expecting from your chosen partner? Do you need content strategy, copywriting, or copy-editing services?	Any new content will be written and edited in-house. We are open to content strategy expertise.
73	If content will be provided by your chosen partner, please give an estimate for how many pages of content will need to be written or edited.	We anticipate that content will be migrated and any new content will be provided by NM Courts.

74	How many unique content types or page layouts should be included in the scope? If you don't know for sure, even a ballpark guess would be helpful. A simple site will consist of 4-6 unique page layouts, a site of medium complexity will consist of 6-12 unique page layouts, a complex site will consist of 12-20+ unique page layouts.	We think medium complexity is fine.
75	Will this project require a substantial amount of data or content migration from the old system to the new one? If so, who will be responsible for this migration? Please estimate how much content, and what types of content, should be migrated over.	Yes. Vendor would be responsible for content migration.
76	How has the Clara avatar been developed (i.e. what technologies are used) and how is it currently implemented at the page level?	Clara uses custom code built on VueJS combined with a SitePal avatar. Pages that show Clara need to include some custom JavaScript, links to JavaScript files (local and external), and a simple <div> tag.
77	What other functionality will the new site need to include? Besides those described in the RFP, are there any features or functions on the current site that need to be available on the new site?	All features and functions currently available need to be addressed in the new site, either with a similar replacement or a redesigned approach deemed to be more effective. It is possible that some features or functions will be agreed-upon as obsolete and no longer needed.
78	Are all the subdomains within the scope of this project all managed through a single CMS instance?	Yes. As described in the RFP, all subdomains need to share the same basic design and allow for limited, agreed-upon customizable elements.
79	Is it acceptable to share documents and links using Google?	This is acceptable as long as the link does not take the user to a Google page. All documents should be downloaded from the NM Courts site.
80	What third-party or legacy applications must the new system interface with? How deep of an integration does each one need?	There is an interactive avatar called Clara that uses a service from SitePal. The API is in JavaScript.

Design Prototype Requirement

81	This represents a very significant amount of work, representing many hours of work over and above the normal RFP response, and we are requesting that the judiciary waive this requirement. The product of any such exercise would not be reflective of our user-centered design approach, since we are asked to develop designs without the benefit of any user research. Insistence on requiring speculative design work as part of the bid response will significantly impact our willingness to submit a proposal.	Our goal is to provide an exceptional user experience to visitors to our NM Courts website. We are very interested in seeing what a compelling, user-centric, user-friendly judicial website could look like, and how such a tool supports access to justice and increases public confidence in the judiciary. The ability to create this user experience is critical for this project, and is an important evaluation criteria for this RFP. We are relying on the Design Prototype requirement to provide this insight. The prototype(s) do not need to be functional, nor fully developed; they do need to demonstrate an understanding of our basic needs and reflect how your firm could support them.
82	For the Design Prototype Requirement: Offerors should propose one, two, or three possible design approaches, each demonstrated by a high-level prototype, for evaluation by NM Courts during the RFP process. Can you confirm that the design concepts are part of the submitted response?	At least one design concept is a mandatory element of the response to this RFP. There is no requirement that the proposed concept(s) be the basis of the eventual website design. We understand that user needs and requirements will be identified during the course of the project and this information will inform the final product.
83	Prototype Requirement - Will consideration be given to removing the requirement of providing multiple prototypes during the RFP process?	
84	Does the AOC expect the sample designs submitted with the RFP to be the basis for the eventual website design? Effective user centered design requires us to have an understanding of the unique user needs related to the website, and we won't have that until after engaged and able to work through our user centered discovery and design process with the AOC team. The RFP response designs may have little in common with what is needed after the discovery process.	

Proposal Response

85	Should vendors provide a point-by-point response to the Mandatory Specifications section?	Yes.
86	Section 9.4 c) suggest that there is a specific response required to the Evaluation Criteria, although there doesn't appear to be anything to respond to directly in the referenced pages. What is required here?	Offerors should provide a quotation for the product/service they are offering.

87	Relevant to 5.1 question 3 regarding successes and failures, what does the AOC consider a failure of a website redesign project?	AOC considers a failure of a website redesign project to be one where the customer is not satisfied.
88	If at all possible, please ensure that the schedule affords bidders a period of at least 10 business days to prepare responses subsequent to Q&A being published.	The submission date is August 1, 2022.
89	Would the State consider allowing bidders the opportunity to submit follow-on questions should there be a need for further clarifications?	No. This is against NM Procurement Code. The procurement manager can answer procedural questions, but questions regarding the tech specs are closed on the 11th. There might be an exception such as a conflict found in the RFP text versus our published responses, but in general the answer is no.
90	Are there specific state government websites the New Mexico Judiciary admires?	Indiana Judicial Branch - in.gov/courts ; Wyoming Judicial Branch - courts.state.wy.us ; Illinois Courts - illinoiscourts.gov
91	User Experience Feedback – Can the focus groups be conducted virtually, or it is required that they be conducted in person?	Focus groups may be conducted virtually.
92	Has any previous user or audience research been completed that can inform this project? For example, do you have documented usability testing, stakeholder interviews, audience surveys, or other research that will be helpful?	We are willing to share any relevant materials with the successful bidder. We have shared the overall results of previous research in the RFP; the current website is not as user friendly and impactful as it should be.
93	What level of training will you require after the website project is complete? Will you just need content contributor training on the CMS, or will you need a deeper, more technical developer training?	We expect to need content contributor training, and some limited admin training for higher level changes. We do not expect to require technical developer training unless there are one or more specialized components included in the final website design. These training needs can be mutually agreed upon during the course of the project.
94	Will proposals be evaluated digitally, or will they be printed for evaluation? Can links be included within our response, for example to resumes?	Digital submissions only. Links are acceptable. However, if the link is broken, or the material unobtainable, a bid may be deemed unresponsive.
95	How many vendors have submitted questions in response to this RFP?	Bidder information is confidential until the RFP is completed. After that all bid materials becomes publicly available. Any information a bidder wishes to remain confidential must be marked as such in their offer. See Section 8, Item 10, pg 11.
96	Once the project has started, what will the makeup of the decision-making committee be like? Will a large group, a small committee, or a single person make decisions?	We anticipate a small committee will make decisions.
97	How should this project be billed? Fixed-bid deliverables based, hourly, monthly retainer, or something else?	We would prefer deliverable based billing, but final determination would be made upon vendor selection.
98	Is there someone who could be considered an incumbent on this project? Is there another company that you've worked with before, or any other company that would receive preference for winning this project?	The RFP process ensures all bidders are considered without preference.
99	When should the project be complete? Is this a critical due date? What event is driving the due date?	The proposed project timeline should be included in your response, and will be finalized as part of the project execution. NM Courts does not have a critical due date driving project completion.
100	Is there anything about your organization that might make this project difficult?	We are relying on the successful bidder to lead us to a new design that creates an effective user experience. The design needs to support the consolidated, statewide judiciary while allowing for a limited amount of flexibility for our 13 judicial districts (sub domains), and provide an easy tool for limited local content updates.
